Dear Parents and Guardians

Farewell to the AiA community

I write to inform you that I will be taking earlier retirement and will now complete my term of office at the end of June, due to a change in my circumstances.

I do hope I can say a proper farewell to those who will attend our delayed Africa day celebration on 22^{nd} of June.

When I started here at AIA in August 2014, I was hired for a primary school on a 2-year contract. I revelled in setting up the governance systems with Mr. Lance Williamson (interim Board Chairman), the structures and blending the Cambridge curriculum (wings) with a South African (roots) / UK home grown curriculum. The HR officer guided me on the community's unspoken rules – my favourite was that one must always wave in recognition of others and greet people at the

shops. I followed his advice. That was my introduction to Aggeneys, and my slow reawakening to the traditions, values, sense of humour and style of cooking of my mother's West coast upbringing. I felt I had, in a sense come back home. That thought comes to mind today as I write, because my 2 years turned into 8 ½ years. For my family and friends, this community became my home; and this community became my community after 8 years of working across the length and breadth of Africa. Your children became my children, and my colleagues formed the AIA family with me.

I had planned to retire this year, and that was common knowledge. This was a wonderful year so far, because for the first time in 8 years I finally had a deputy with whom I could bounce ideas, strategies and share jokes. I have enjoyed these months of working with and handing over responsibilities to Mr. Bugan who has taken the torch and started running with it already. Together, and with our wonderful SMT we are currently working on several transformative strategies and action that we hope will take AIA successfully into a dynamic and exciting new era.

SCHOOL ASSESSMENTS, EXAMS, HOMEWORK AND REPORTS



Please disregard Dennis' comment. We know our work, and we know your child. Please allow us to share our concerns about the "Dennis" characters in the upper primary and lower secondary who have been slacking towards end of the term, not doing homework, and not studying for exams.

Teachers expressed disappointment about some children – the same learners in all their subjects – who could not demonstrate evidence of work in their books or evidence of learning in revision week. Just as parents go to work, children's work is school and learning.

We advise parents to read the comments, and sit down with their child, to discuss the report. Children may have a low mark, but the comment will show that their effort is highly commendable. Praise your child in such a case.

If your child is underperforming due to negligence, laziness, or inconsistency of effort they need a jolly good talking.

Remember if their mark is below 50% again, they will be retained in their present class next year.

A child can do well all term, then panic in the exams; or a child can be inconsistent all term in terms of deliverables yet excel in the exams. We often remind children: their homework and class book projects are what makes up the 50% / 40% / 30%. If they do not submit work, they get a zero. Sadly, some classes have seen a low-class average mark because of the learners who are not pulling their weight, and don't seem to care if they do not get a mark. Remember, we compute results on the following basis:

✓ KS1:

Report mark is compiled on basis of 50% term mark and 50% exam / assessment mark

✓ KS2:

Report mark is compiled on basis of 40% term mark and 60% exam mark

✓ KS3:

Report mark is compiled on basis of 30% term mark and 70% exam mark.

REPORTS:

Reports will go out on the last day of term. Only in very special cases will the office send a report to a parent before the end of term.

If children leave before term closes, parents will receive the reports online on the 23^{rd,} and can collect the sealed original on first day of the new school term from the office.
