#### Dear Parents and Guardians

Yet, I would encourage parents, teachers, and pupils to take time at the start of this year to discuss your hopes. We have a much better chance of realising our hopes in a team effort with those who care. The sky is the limit in a community where we sincerely want each other to succeed.

The expectations and hopes we carry with us into a new school year have a flipside, of course: fear of failure. It is our human nature to fear 'What if?' #### GENERAL

A well-organised school is extremely important for a positive learning environment. Please see a few important pointers below to ensure this positive learning environment.

#### School Times

Academy: Starting time: 07:10 (All Key stages) Dismissal times: Key stage 1: 12:30 Key stage 2 & 3: 13h30

Eagle House Hybrid School dismissal time: 14h15

All students to be in class at 07:10 daily when the bell rings and where daily attendance will be taken. Our timetable for teaching starts at 07:15. Students to be always punctual.

#### Summer Uniform

All students must wear their summer uniform every day. Please ensure your child is dressed accordingly and that they are compliant with haircuts, girls' hairstyles, sock colours, and PE uniform. We do not mind the winter polar fleece jacket on cooler days... but not on normal hot days. Key stage 2 and 3 only wears PE uniform on their days for PE. Ensure your child has a water bottle filled with water to stay hydrated during these hot days.

### COMMUNICATION

I said at our meet and greet that we would like to improve on communication for this year and going forward. I would like to remind all parents, old and new, of the following forms of communication:

WhatsApp – the school uses the AIA Noticeboard on this platform to make official announcements. We are also using the platform for different classes. Teachers will make announcements here to communicate with class parents directly. Times for communication between teachers and parent are between 7:00am – 6.30pm. Please respect these times. No teacher is allowed to communicate with any parent during teaching time. If it is an emergency matter, please contact the office of the secretary.

### **VISITING THE ACADEMY OR BRIGHT BEGINNINGS**

- Please drop learner's off in the designated parking areas (either in front of BB or opposite the Academy where the parents normally park).
- Parents are reminded to make an appointment with the principal or the class teacher before any consultation can happen.
- No parent is allowed to visit his/her child's class teacher without signing the visitor's register in the secretary's office.
- Please remember to follow these rules because they are essential to the safeguarding of our learners.

#### WHEN A PROBLEM ARISES:

There are going to be times when a problem arises, and you need to come to the school. We are always open to listening to you our client, but would like to remind you to take the following steps to resolve the issue:

- It is your responsibility to listen to your child. Please remind yourself that his/her version must be corroborated by the teacher/s.

It does not help you, the parent, if you seek help from another parent to resolve the issue. If you follow this route, it leads to unnecessary miscommunications and leaves you and the child, with no resolution. If the problem is at the school, resolve it with the school. We are here to support you and your child in any way we can.

As part of the strategy to brand ourselves as a private school, branding will help to foster a sense of identity, discipline, safety, equality, and community when implementing uniforms with school logos or unified colours. 
